## Power Outage in June

The Airport is scheduled to do electrical work during the last week of June for the new Fire Station. A new power supply will replace the outdated system currently in place. The location for the work is the drive lane on the west side of Building 221 (ME 262 Project). Some traffic revisions will be necessary during the scope of the project to accommodate the workers and equipment.

At some point in the project, the power will be cut off to Building 221, the west ramp hangars and the fire shop. It is anticipated the outage will last eight hours and will probably take place mid-week. The outage timeframe is estimated to be between 5:00 pm until midnight. ## Wildlife Hazard Reminders

Matt Stevens, USDA Wildlife Biologist stationed at Paine Field, would like to remind pilots and airport tenants that the spring migration and summer breeding season is in full swing for local bird populations. Please be aware that over the next few months, bird harassment and dispersal activities may be conducted more frequently than usual. These activities include the use of pyrotechnics. If you hear or see "fireworks" on the airfield, it is Matt or other Paine Field personnel trying to keep our flying environment free from wildlife hazards. As always, we ask that you keep dumpster lids securely closed and remind everyone that feeding birds on Paine Field property is strictly prohibited. ## New Hangar Rental Rates

**Effective August 1, 2008**

Central Ramp/Old West Ramp Hangars: T-Hangar Rental Rates for the standard 40' T-Hangars will increase to \$275.00 effective August 1, 2008. This includes state leasehold excise tax. Non-standard hangars and storerooms will have a similar percentage rate adjustment.

New West Ramp Hangars: Tenants in the new west ramp hangars received a 3 year stepped increase that began August 1, 2006. The third increase is effective August 1, 2008. Reminder notices have been sent out.

August statements will reflect the new rate and will also include the one-time increase in the security deposit. The Airport will automatically deduct the new rate from autopay customers. For more info, contact Susan Kern: 425-388-5103.
