County Executive Aaron Reardon accepts a check for \$508,186 from Travis Snider, Chairman of the Board of the Snohomish County Public Facilities District. These funds will be used to develop the Museum and Conference Center.

On June 29th, it was announced that the Paine Field Aviation Museum/Conference Center and Boeing Tour Center will open in Summer 2005. Boeing will move their Boeing Tour Center from the Everett plant to operate in the new facility. Beechwood Development (Hilton Hotels) will build a 104 room hotel adjacent to the Museum.

The new facility is expected to transform Snohomish County and Paine Field from being a **stop and go** experience into a **stop and stay** international tourist destination.

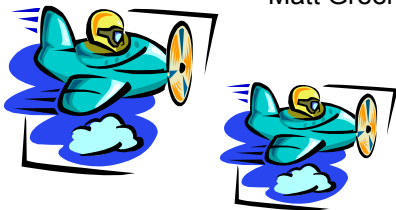
