Boeing Aircraft Parking On Paine Field

During the flight test program for the new 787 and 747-8 aircraft, Boeing plans to store 15 new airplanes temporarily outside normal Boeing ramp areas. The temporary storage will be on Kilo North by the Future of Flight, the Outer Terminal Ramp by the FAA Air Traffic Control Tower, Runway 11/29 and the South Ramp east of the new Fire Station. The storage will last up to 10 months and is necessary to accommodate customer delivery schedules and adhere to 747-8 and 787 Dreamliner flight-test schedules. Any activities that create noise will be performed during the normal daytime hours and will comply with the County noise ordinance. No planned activities that produce audible community noise will be performed overnight.

New Enhanced Taxiway Centerline Markings at K6

Runway 16R-34L will be closed for maintenance from 9 p.m. on Friday, July 16 until 7 a.m. Sunday, July 18.

During this time the Airport will perform minor asphalt repair and repainting of the entire main runway. The painting will involve the installation of surface painted hold signs and enhanced taxiway centerline markings at every runway intersection on the Airport.
