Central Ramp Activity



King County Airport (Boeing Field in Seattle) has started a major renovation of their 10,000' main runway. The runway was closed August 13-24, and will have intermittent closures through October. The majority of the displaced aircraft have temporarily relocated to other airports, including a small portion to Paine Field.



KILO 1 Taxiway

Work is rapidly progressing on the new Kilo 1 taxiway and parking apron projects. This new 1000' long taxiway will connect at the threshold of runway 16R and continue west towards the Future of Flight. There will also be a new concrete parking apron built adjacent to the Future of Flight to accommodate aircraft deliveries and other special events. Construction began in early July and will continue into October. During construction, the Glideslope to runway 16R will be shutdown until October due to the grading and paving activities taking place in the glideslope critical area. However, the localizer will continue to operate.

PLEASE NOTE: the runway 16R threshold will be relocated 1500' south for 20 consecutive days starting Tuesday, September 5 until Monday, September 25, leaving 7,500' of runway available for takeoff and landing. The entire runway will be closed for 3 hours on the morning of September 5 to accommodate the threshold relocation.

Malibu Fly-in

MMOPA (Malibu, Mirage/Meridan Owners and Pilots Association) held a fly-in/training session at Paine Field during August. Since these planes are normally flown at high altitude, the Association trains and tests their member pilots to the same standards as airline pilots. The training is held annually for recurrence and every six months for safety training. Planes came from as far away as the East Coast, Chicago, and Texas.



Painting Project

In late August, the Airport began painting all runways, taxiways, and ramps including surface preparation on 11-29 and Taxiway A. The project is scheduled for completion by mid-September. The improvements will include the surface preparation of the 16R/34L edge lines and the repainting of all markings. The surface preparation will remove the built-up layers of old paint from previous projects. The fresh paint is really needed on many of the hold lines and vehicle control lines. The visibility of the lines will greatly enhance pilot and ground vehicle safety. The Airport's contractor, Apply-A-Line, has completed numerous projects on the Airport and is considered one of the best contractors in the country for airfield painting. We look forward to working with Apply-A-Line and using their expertise to improve the airfield. Please be aware of NOTAMS and airfield closures during this project.
