Summer Construction

Work has begun on the final phase of the taxiway Alpha rehabilitation project.

Taxiway Alpha will be closed from A1-A3 through the end of September. In addition to repaving the mainline portion of taxiway Alpha from A2 to A3, this project will construct a new taxiway intersection from runway 16R-34L to taxiway Alpha, immediately adjacent to the Boeing south ramp. Once completed, this new taxiway intersection will be called A3, and every runway intersection south of this new taxiway will increase by one. Phone Bruce Goetz at 425-388-5110 with questions.

Power Outages Planned *First Outage Sept. 25, 7 a.m. - 7 p.m.*

The Public Utility District #1 (PUD) developed plans to improve the reliability of Airport electrical service in some areas north of runway 11-29. There are 4+ miles of 30 yr old underground power cables in need of replacement. A multiday unplanned outage in March was the result of failed portions of this cable. Replacing cable requires power outages to safely perform the work. The PUD will try to minimize duration and number of outages and tenant impact. The first phase in August installed a north end power loop adjacent to the Boeing flight line and allows the PUD to replace old cable with a controlled series of Eight (8) Twelve (12) hour power outages limited to small segments.

The **first outage** planned for **7am-7pm Saturday September 25** will affect buildings: **C1,2,3,4,5,51,52,53,54,55,56,57,58,59,60,61,62,63,64,70,71,74,75** as well as the self serve fuel island and gates N2 and N5.

The **second outage** planned for **7am-7pm on Friday October 8** will affect buildings **C5 and 71**.

The **third outage** is planned for **7am-7pm on Friday October 22** and will affect buildings: **C-51,52,53,54,55,56,58,59,60,61,62,63,64,70** as well as the self serve fuel island and gate N2.

The **fourth outage** is planned for **7am-7pm Friday November 5** and will affect buildings: **C51,52,53,54,55,56,58,59,60,61,62,63,64** as well as the self serve fuel island and gate N2.

Dates are subject to change pending weather emergency power outages for PUD crews. Outages 5-8 which affect buildings north of 100th street are tentatively scheduled for Spring 2011. We appreciate your patience during inconveniences associated with this important infrastructure upgrade and will continue to update our tenants.
