Runway 16R-34L is Open

After nearly 2 months of construction, the main runway at Paine Field has been rehabilitated. Work involved removing and replacing 3" of asphalt. Additionally, the north 1000' of the runway was completely removed and replaced with a new 16" thick concrete section. All told, over 42,000 tons of asphalt and 21,000



cubic yards of concrete were placed to finish this job. Additionally, nearly 300 in flush mount in-pavement lights were set to light the runway. Work will continue at night on light fixtures and runway grooving. **Check Your NOTAMS carefully!**

Airport Rules and Regulations

The Airport has completed a "draft" of the Airport Rules and Regulations handbook and is now ready to post it on the Airport's website for initial comments and feedback. This handbook was created to provide tenants and Airport users with a better understanding of the policies and procedures set by the Snohomish County Code and the Airport. These Rules and Regulations restate and elaborate on the County Code and the existing policies for leases, licenses, or deeds and will provide one central document that better identifies the operations and general usage of the Airport.

Bernie Webber Drive (BWD) Grand Opening, Noon, Oct. 16

The Corporate Aviation Developments at the south west corner of the Airport received a boost with the completion of the south section of Bernie Webber Drive. Named after former Airport commissioner, aviation enthusiast and world acclaimed artist, Bernie Webber Drive connects to the Mukilteo Speedway (SR525) at the Chennault Beach Road signal. As further corporate hangar facilities are constructed in the southwest corner of the Airport, Bernie Webber Drive will be extended up to an ultimate length of 1.4 miles to provide additional access. The Public is invited to a ribbon cutting grand opening to be held at noon on Friday, October 16 with a small reception following at the Historic Aircraft Foundation Hangar on Bernie Webber Drive.

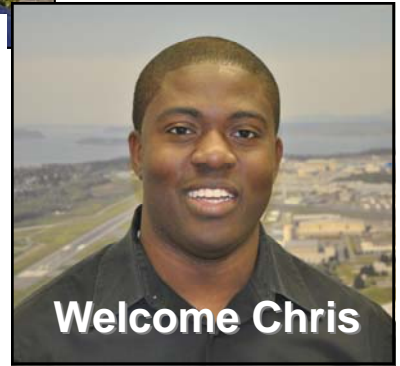
Commando Road

Traffic News

With the opening of the new fire station, this is a reminder to everyone to slow down when approaching the fire station on the airside. The new speed limit is 10 miles per hour when passing the fire station. Emergency vehicles may be responding from the station at any time and drivers may not be able to see vehicles traveling near the station. Vehicle travel lanes will soon be painted in this area. The speed limit is 15 miles per hour for all airside travelers. Speed limits are enforceable by a traffic infraction of a minimum of \$124.00 and higher. Your assistance is appreciated.
